Pathfinding – The Case of Wende High School



- History, school size, and staff: Public high school founded in 2003 # of students ~1700 Teachers: mostly new college grads
- Lowest in local high school ranking

- Status of students: bottom students in high-school entrance exams, 80% from rural areas
- Academic performance: college admission rate 5%, junior college admission rate 40%

Wende High School Library



- Established in 2003 1 stack room, 1 reading room, each 80m² ~20K volumes of books, ~50 newspapers & magazines
- Development guided by Evergreen since 2005



Advanced ideas and intellectual inputs from external; Cultivate seed teachers

 - 1. Circulation automation (completed August 2006)



Pathfinding – The Case of Kaili No. 1 High School

- History, school size, and staff:

 Founded in 1941
 Provincial model high school
 # of students ~5400
 15 prefecture-level
 teaching experts (65%)
- Students: top students in high-school entrance exams
- Academic performance: college admission rate >85%
- Facility: new campus funded by city government put into use in 2011





New library opening in 2011
 2 book stack rooms ~800m²
 3 reading rooms ~1000m²
 E-reading room ~400m²

Collection
 120K+ volumes of books
 150K+ volumes of e-books
 200+ newspapers and magazines

Partnered with EEF in 2011

Team Building

- Librarians: service spirits, career incentives, use one's strength (2=>5)
- Student volunteers: service spirit, working skills (a few => 120+)
- A blog, and a social network group to connect librarians, teachers and students


